

GAME FORMATS

Championship	Two weeks of standard scoring. Champion is lowest gross total. Medallion is lowest net total. Must reside in Cross Creek to be Club Champion or Medallion winner. See additional Championship Rules posted on the web page
Crier's Day	At the end of the 9-hole round each player selects one hole which she does not want to count. That hole's score is "thrown out" or subtracted from the total. Net handicap is subtracted.
Even Holes	The entire round's scores are kept for entry in the computer. This game score is a total of ONLY the even holes – 2, 4, 6 and 8. Net handicap is subtracted.
Low Gross – Low Net	Winners are those with the lowest gross and/or net scores.
Low Putts	In this game, only the putts are counted for game purposes. The entire round's scores are still kept for entry in the computer.
Threes	Only score the par 3 holes for the game. (Keep total 9-hole score to enter in computer.) Net handicap subtracted.
Closest to Pin	When a tee shot is closest to the hole on the green. To be considered, it must rest on the putting surface. Measured from the edge of hole to center of golf ball where it rests.
Odd Holes	Although the entire round's scores are kept for entry in the computer, the game score consists of ONLY the scores on the 1 st , 3 rd , 5 th , 7 th and 9 th holes added together. Net handicap subtracted.
Lucky 7	Each player may subtract the scores for two holes in that round. Net handicap subtracted.
3 Clubs and a Putter	Players carry only three clubs and a putter. The remaining clubs must be left behind. <u>Please determine your three clubs well before getting to the clubhouse.</u> Full handicap subtracted.
Center Cut	Center of score card: holes 3-7, net handicap subtracted.
Mystery Holes	The Golf Pro secretly selects the holes to be counted. Net handicap subtracted.

All strokes are counted in league game of day.
